RADISYS AND INTRINSYC BLEND THEIR NT EMBEDDED CONTROL PRODUCTS

RadiSys Corporation and Intrinsyc Software have signed a deal to meld their respective embedded systems software development tools for NT and Windows CE. Under the terms of the pact, RadiSys' INtime hard real-time kernel and Intrinsyc's forthcoming Integration Expert (IX) development tool kit will be married in a package that RadiSys will sell for embedded NT use. IX is scheduled to go to beta on July 1 with release around the end of Q3. As part of the deal, Intrinsyc's also going to build a version of IX tailored for CE running on x86 processors, hardly a surprise since Intel owns a 20% stake in RadiSys. Meanwhile, Intrinsyc is also going to integrate INtime into its WinFT software for automatic software-based fault detection and correction and into its SP visual programming environment for developing high-performance signal processing apps.
